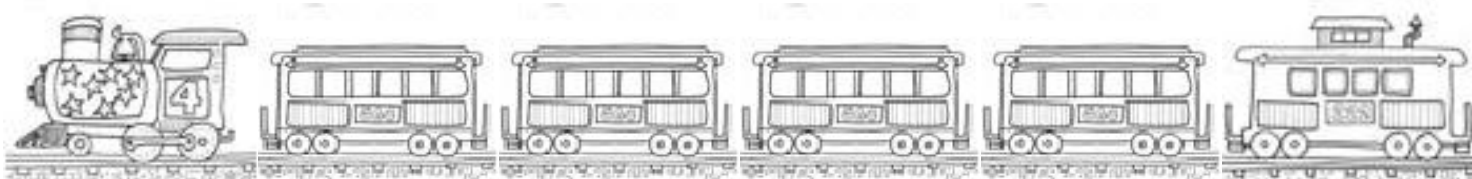

Pourquoi est-ce que tu vas au supermarché?

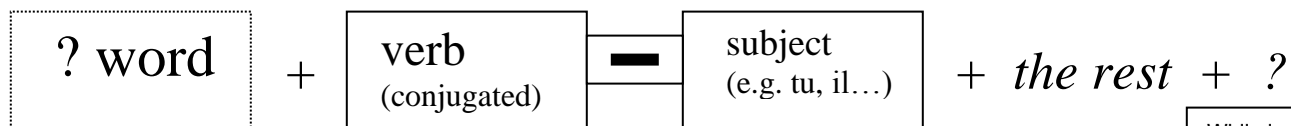
How many sisters do you have?

How many sisters do you have?

Combien de soeurs as-tu?

Are you going to the party?

Vas-tu à la fête?
